Dear Mr. Wesolowski,


I was very pleased to receive your reception report dated April 16, 1972. I didn't know that our signal got as far as Omaha. At the time you copied our signal, we were running a full kilowatt for frequency test purposes. Normally, we operate at 250 watts in the nighttime. I found your report to be quite accurate and very concise. Well done!

If you want a real challenge, try to receive our auxiliary transmitter tests after one o'clock, early Sunday mornings. At that time, our power is 250 watts, with test music and frequent test IDs.

As for our transmission equipment, we use an RCA BTA-LR1 for our main unit, and an RCA BTA-250 M for our auxiliary unit, both operating on 1340 kHz.

Again, thanks for the excellent report and the best of 73s to you.
