Dear Sir;

WJPS is pleased to confirm your report of reception of our 1 kilowatt signal on the morning of January 6, 1963. Your report was quite accurate, for the time period of 12:58 AM CST until 1:02 AM CST.

Our transmitter is located about four miles north of Evansville. Our exact location is :  $38^{\circ} 03' 12.3''$  North Latitude and  $87^{\circ} 35' 40.5''$  West Longitude.

We use a three tower array, consisting of three 200' self-supporting steel towers equally spaced on a line 18 degrees east of north. We use two of them in the daytime, and all three at night. Our main daytime lobe is radiated in the aforementioned direction. Most of our signal at night goes approximately southwest.

I'm sorry, but we have no extra coverage maps or Record Surveys available.
