Mr. Wesolowski:

I am pleased to verify your reception of our station on December 16, 1961. I was able to verify all the information you gave with exception of the weather report, which of course, we do not keep on file.

I'm sorry I didn't receive your first reception report, however I've just returned to work for KCKN after having been away for a period of two years, and perhaps it was misplaced during the change of engineers.

In regard to the 1,000 watts, we are now in the process of installation of the 1,000 watt transmitter, and hope to have it on the air by the middle of July. In addition to this, KCKN has received a CONSTRUCTION PERMIT for an FM station to operate on 94.1 mc's with an ERP of 20,000 watts. We hope to have this on the air by next Fall.

In regard to the coverage maps, our supply has long since been depleted, and we are waiting on the kilowatt to have more printed showing the 1,000 watt coverage. These should be ready within three to four weeks.
