

Regarding your reception report (#72-118), I am pleased to verify your report of receiving WFLW on Thursday, September 14, 1972. It was 100% accurate. The fading in the test tone that you mentioned is due to the cartridge containing the tone recycling.

WFLW currently employs a standard Collins, Type No. 20V-2, 1000 watt transmitter. The antenna is a 185' guyed, shunt-excited, vertical steel tower. Program on WFLW, a daytime station, consists of a block format of country and gospel music until 3 pm, and pop music until sign-off.
