Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on Monday, February 11, 1963
from 4:31 A M to 4:39 A M Central Standard Time on 1550 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

- CST-4:31:30 Station ID: "...and this is KOKA in Shreveport."
- 4:31:45 Church and PTA Announcements given. (Negro Announcer)
Program called BULLETIN BOARD.
- 4:37:20 Station ID: "This is Koka Land, KOKA in Shreveport."
- 4:37:30 Recorded Instrumental Music.

This is the first time that I have heard KOKA on 1550kcs. I visited your station in Shreveport on December 30, 1959, when you were on 980 kcs. Somehow, your Chief Engineer did not answer a early report, so while I was in your city, I visited you and received a Letter of Verification from your manager, Mr. O.M. Teate.

May I now please have a Verification of reception, typed on your KOKA Letterhead, stating the date & time of this report. Do you also have an extra COVERAGE MAP available? How many towers do you not have and where is the transmitter located in Shreveport?
