Gentlemen:

I am pleased to report reception of your station on Saturday, April 8, 1972
from 7:00 PM to 7:02 PM Central Standard Time on 1150 kcs.

Items and announcements heard on this broadcast are as follows:

- 7:00 CST SIGN-OFF ANNOUNCEMENT for Radio Station K A S M in Albany, Minnesota, operating on 1150 Khz....
- 7:00:30 NATIONAL ANTHEM
- 7:01:45 CARRIER OFF!

This is the first time that I have heard K A S M Radio from Omaha. Your signal was heard over & under station KSAL in Salina, Kansas, which went into their Directional Antenna Pattern at 7pm, thus decreasing their signal strength here. However there was one other station in Texas that also was signing off the air, at this same time.

You may be interested in knowing that WCCO-830 & KSTP-1500 in Minneapolis and KTOE-1420 from Mankato are heard well here nightly.

I received your name from a verification letter you sent to my DX friend Bruce Reynolds of Warrensburg, Missouri back on 11-30-68.
