As a Daytime only station, we operate between sunrise and sunset, local.

For your information, here is a brief sketch on KADY. This station first began commercial broadcasting on April 3, 1958. Our combined studio-transmitter building is located 3 miles north of St. Charles, Missouri, just across the Missouri River from St. Louis, Missouri. We have a two element directional antenna system oriented 247° from true North. We are completely Collins equipped; utilizing a 5KW/10KW Collins 21E/M Transmitter, a Collins 212E-1 Broadcast Console, and three new Collins Broadcast Turntables. We also have Magnecord and Presto Tape Units. Our building contains a main studio, control room-studio combination, and all the necessary office and utility space.

Thank you for your report and your interest in our station. If you ever find yourself in this part of the "Show-me" State please drop by and see us. Everyone is more than welcome to view our excellent facilities and to meet "the gang".
