Thank you for the reception report you sent us recently regarding our carrier and modulation test of March 31, 1963 at 12:21am to 12:25am on 900 kilocycles. Thanks for the strong signal report of S9 plus 20db.

Our transmitter is located a few miles south west of Fargo and the studios are in the Gate City Savings and Loan Building in downtown Fargo. At this time we do not have any coverage maps in print but our coverage is better to the north and south even though we have a non-directional antenna. All radio stations in this area with transmitters in the Red River Valley have more field strength to the north and south per watt than most areas in the U.S. The ground wave conditions in this area are unusually good. Our station has received reports from as far south as Texas.

As a radio amateur (WØBIW) I am quite impressed with your rhombic antenna.
