Dear Mr. Wesolowski,

Thanks much for your letter reporting your reception of KNDK on November 13 from 3:01 to 3:10 AM CST.

I'm sorry that I haven't answered before this, but we've been in the process of moving into our new studios and it seems that I haven't had time to do much other than regular maintenance on the equipment.

We were on the air the morning of November 13 from 3:00 to 4:00 AM CST for the purpose of a frequency and equipment check and comparing your reception report to our logs, it is correct.

We received eighteen reception reports as a result of this test, the farthest in distance being from Vallejo, California.

KNDK is a 1000 watt non-directional daytime station and for being just a kilowatter, we have a tremendous coverage area. Our programming is mainly MOR with some C&W.

Since we have no coverage map as such, I am enclosing one of our rate cards on which you'll find a map of our coverage at 0.5 mv/m.

Once again, thanks for writing and if you have any further questions or comments, feel free to write and I'll try to be a little quicker on the answering end of things than I have been this time.
