Dear Mr. Wesolowski:

We were very pleased to hear your report of reception of KTNB on March 26. With the weather as bad as it was at the time, we're very surprised to get such a relatively good report.

You are correct, we do operate on 100 watts power. Our tower is located just west of Falls City on Highway 4. It is in a fairly low spot with a small creek near to it. Some of our ground system radials cross under the stream. This ground gives us an exceptional daytime signal for 100 watts. At night our signal drops to about 15 or 20 miles although we have had reports from Wisconsin and Minnesota telling us that we were coming in fairly well in the early morning hours.

We operate on a 6am to 11pm schedule Monday through Saturday. On Sunday 7am to 10pm.

I'm not sure I completely understand your question concerning frequency checks. We are checked monthly by Commercial Radio Monitoring in Kansas City, Missouri. Possibly you meant when we would be on during hours other than our regular schedule. If this is the case, we are scheduling a test broadcast for Monday, April 6th, between 12:01am and 2am. If you could find time to listen at that time we would appreciate another report.

Thank you for your fine report. I'm sure any station would be happy to receive one.
