Dear Mr. Wesolowski:

Thank you for your most excellent report of reception of this station from 1:10 to 1:50 AM on 23 October 1961.

We have no available coverage maps, however our pattern is nearly circular, primary coverage area radius is about 100 miles.


Our transmitter is of Collins manufacture, using a single 3X2500A3 in the final, modulated by a pair of 3X3000A1s. The antenna is a single quarter wave vertical, shunt fed at about the 45 foot level. As we are located in the South Eastern part of New Mexico, the territory is rather flat and dry. The weather at time of transmission was cool and perfectly clear, without wind.

Today is the second day we have received cards and letters from the transmission you heard. So far we have received 65, plus 2 phone calls, from a transmission that lasted 90 minutes. We have heard from 16 states. This came as a surprise to me, since we seldom run such a high number of replies.

We will be on the air again under similar circumstances again this coming Friday night, signing on the air at about midnight MST, continuing for about 30 to 60 minutes. We have a scheduled frequency measurement this coming Sunday night at midnight, which program is already recorded, with organ music.

Thank you again for your report. May we hear from you again?
