



Dear Mr. Wesolowski;

Thank you for your fine report of reception of WPUT during our recent test broadcast. We're pleased to verify your reception of WPUT, 1510 kilohertz, on Monday morning February 10, 1975 between 2:03am and 2:17am E.S.T. During this time, WPUT was using its regular daytime power of 895 watts. We have a single tower, 140 feet high, located outside our studio and office building about 3/4 mile north of the village of Brewster, N.Y. Our tower is on the side of a hill which rises toward the west. I'm not sure if the top of the tower even clears the hilltop, and I thought our signal would suffer to the west as a result. However, the bulk of our reports came from west of here, yours being one of the most distant. We heard from a total of 69 DXers after this test; Carl Dabelstein in Lincoln was most distant. We consider the test very successful.
