Dear Mr. Wesolowski,

In regards to your letter dated November 26, 1962, We would like to say that we are sorry that you didn't receive an answer sooner. The station had an engineer change just shortly after your letter was received. Apparently your letter was overlooked and placed in the engineering desk where it was found this week.

We are always pleased to hear from locations far from KAGO reporting they have picked up our signal.

You asked about a coverage map, record survey and the location and number of our towers and transmitter. A coverage map couldn't be found and there is a current record survey enclosed. We make up our own record surveys from local sales, requests and national interest. Our towers, transmitter and studios are located approximately one quarter mile outside the Klamath Falls city limits on the west side of town. We are located on top of a hill overlooking the city of Klamath Falls and the surrounding valley. We operate at 5kw daytime and 1 kw nighttime with a phased pattern at night protecting north and south. We use a two tower system and have a five bay Collins transmitter. We hope that this gives you the information that you were inquiring about.

We would appreciate any further communication with you regarding a pickup of KAGO's signal. Your letters will be answered promptly in the future. Again our apologies for the delay in this letter.

Please keep listening for KAGO and don't let this delay keep you from writing us anytime.
