Dear Mr. Wesolowski:

Thank you for your letter and report of the reception of CKSA 1150 Radio from 12:06 A.M. to 12:20:30 A.M. on January 7, 1965. I am pleased to verify your report as correct.

At the time you received us we were on a DA2 mode of emission but since you wrote we have changed our frequency and are now operating on a frequency of 1080 Kc/s. Our studios are located in down town Lloydminster on the Alberta side of the Alberta - Saskatchewan border. The transmitter is four miles south of the city at latitude $53^{\circ} 13' 17''$ north and longitude $110^{\circ} 00' 23''$ west.

We use a Gates 10,000 watt A.M. transmitter and our antenna system is composed of three 195' vertical towers with a DAN mode of emission 24 hours per day.
