Thank you for the letter reporting reception of our radio station 8 May 75 from 8:30 to 8:33 PM. Your report was verified by our program log. Sorry I am so late in answering-but you know how those things are. Note also that you received our station back in '61, this is interesting. The storm that we were talking about did not do any damage in this area, most of it passed North and East of us. From what we see on the Weather Wire and TV, you people are also familiar with stormy weather at times.

We are a 500 watt unlimited time Country Music station. Our transmitter is an RCA BTA-1S. We specialize in News and Sports. We are non-directional daytime and directional at night using two towers. Our main studios are in town, the transmitter site located just out of the city limits--about three miles away. We operate with Third Class operators during daytime by remote control. At night we have First Class operators on transmitter duty.

Victoria is about 50,000 population located about mid-way between Houston, Corpus Christi and San Antonio. We are about 25 miles from the Gulf Of Mexico and about 225 miles from Mexico. We have manufacturing plants in the area but we are still somewhat (small town). Local activities are mostly oil, ranching and farming.

Again Ernest, We appreciate the report. Hope we do not have to wait 14 years to hear from you again.
