I was very pleased to receive your report of reception of our station.


This letter is to confirm that report, on Saturday, June 18, 1960, between 0001 and 0030 C.S.T., we had a tone of 1000 cps on the air for 15 minutes, followed by recorded music.

Our studios and transmitter are located in the Northeast portion of Fort Worth, about 4 miles from the heart of the city. Our antenna is a single tower, guyed, with a height of 269 ft. It is series-excited. The ground system consists of 120 radials, each 264 ft. long.
