We are the regional A. B. C. outlet for Central Texas, operating with 1,000 watts power day and night on 1460 Kilocycles. We operate with a directional pattern at night with our heaviest signals in the Northwesterly and Southeasterly directions. Our transmitter is an RCA BTA-1-L, and our studio equipment was custom-built by Collins.
