This is to confirm your reception of WYVE Radio on the morning of March 8, 1976 between the hours of 0300 and 0400 Eastern Standard Time.


WYVE Radio came on the air September 21, 1949, being one of the first stations in Southwest Virginia. The station, located in Wytheville "The Hub of Southwest Virginia", is the only station in Wythe and Bland Counties and carries the task of serving both counties with entertainment, news, and information.

Our studios are located in downtown Wytheville at the corner of First and Spring streets. The transmitter site is on Holston Road across town.

The main transmitter is a 1973 Sparta 701B, and the auxillary is a 1949 Gates BC1-f. (the Sparta was used during the test.) We are a non-directional station on 1280 KHz with 1000 watts of power.
