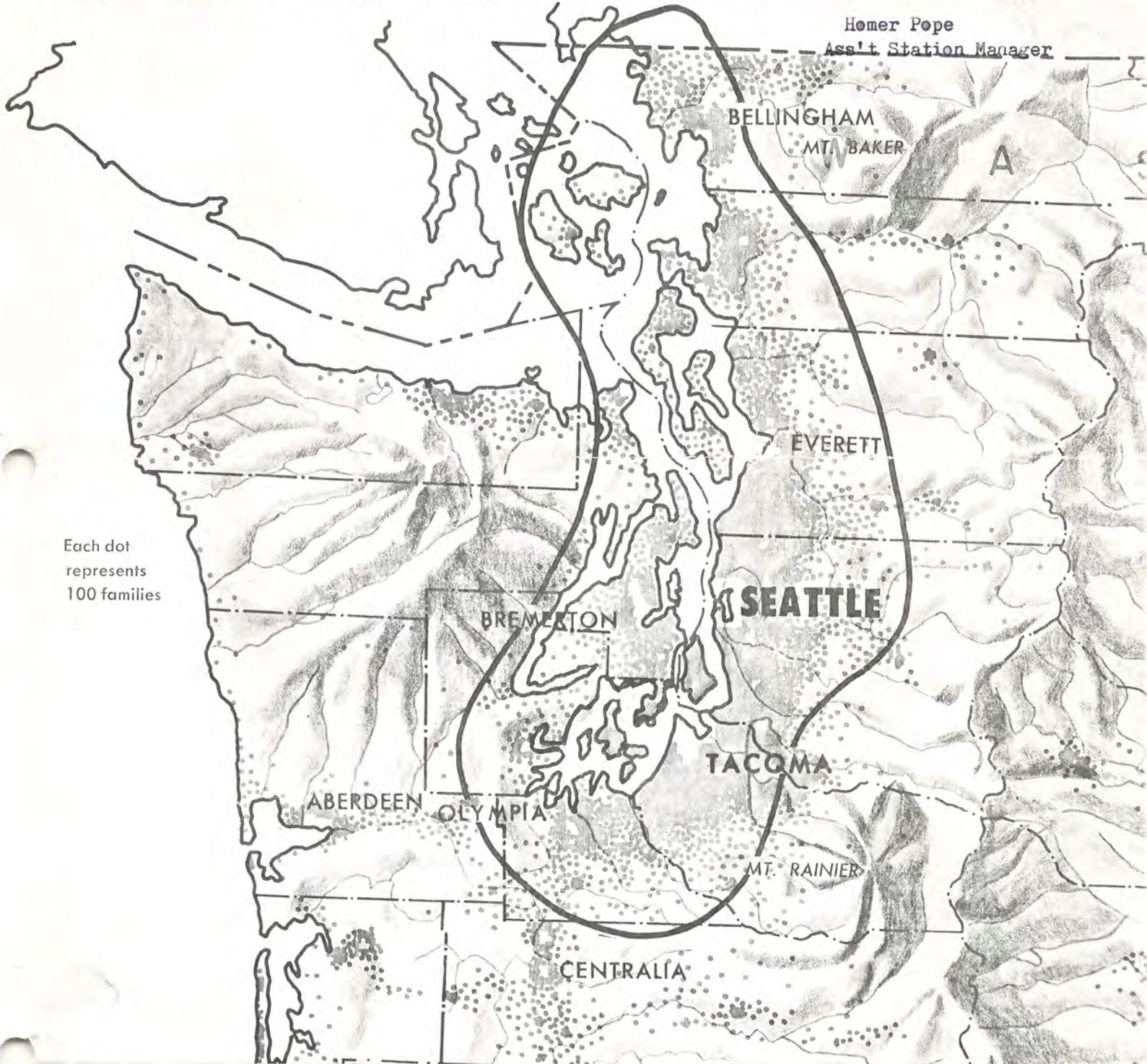


# KJR SEATTLE 24 hours a day 5000 watts 950 KC
