Thank you for your accurate description of our test we conducted on MONDAY, November 17th, 1969, Your description from 1:05AM-1:25 AM Pacific Standard time, was right as rain. I did not use a 1,000 cycle tone. It was more like 600 cycles and quite low for cutting thru static. I shall use a 1,000 tone or "slightly" higher next time, and play strictly band march music. Then there will be music that can be told apart. Do you agree? And other suggestions I'll gladly use. Richard Wood in Hawaii was listening but don't know yet if he got us. I heard Prineville Oregon on 690 on the way to the station that night. And we got 2 other letters so far besides yours but it's too early to tell where it dropped down. The other 2 letters were from Portland Oregon and Salem Oregon. We have just had the 2 tests to date, and the farthest East is Brigham City Utah. (Dennis Pimper)

Your 1025 veries sound great. I used to have a Hallicrafters SX-71 and loved it but sold it for 100.00 and shouldn't have. I didn't even know clubs like the IRCA were around. But the bug is biting. And being an engineer makes it worse.

Thanks again for your letter Ernie and I'll let you inow what the final results of this test are. Thanks again and I'll write later but wanted to get your verie right in the mail as soon as I could.
