Dear Mr. Wesolowski:

My thanks for your reception report of WBUC Radio on December 10, 1962. Your report is correct, and I am happy to send this letter as a verification.

WBUC is three years old this month. We began with 1,000 watts and increased power to 5,000 watts on August 4, 1962. The new transmitter is a Gates model BC-5-P2. It uses a single triode tube type 3X2500F3 to develop the 5,000 watts of carrier.

Our transmitting antenna is a 200 foot tower located on flat ground in a small valley. It is located 380 feet from the transmitter and is fed with buried co-ax.

The transmitter and studio are in the same building. We regularly program from three turntables, four tape players and three microphone inputs as well as the beep phone and remote lines. We have a second control room used mainly for commercial recording and program production.

Once again, thanks for your report. We were happy to have the special test broadcast because we have no regular test period. Thus we will not have any need for nighttime transmission until almost a year has gone by and we will need to check the equipment for response and distortion.
