Dear Mr. Wesolowski,

This is to confirm your reception report of January 30, 1967 at 1:22 A.M. of radio station KOWB.

We were on the air at that time testing our transmitter and our modulation. We are always interested in where we could be received under ideal conditions. It was interesting to know that KOIL is now leaving the air on Monday mornings since it explains the increase in reception reports from the east of us.

I am sorry, we don't have a coverage map but I will describe the patterns for you. Our day-time pattern using 5,000 watts is beamed toward the central portion of Wyoming (towards Casper, Wyo.) and our night-time pattern using 1,000 watts has two lobes (beaming directions) one is directed towards Rawlins while the other lobe is directed toward Torrington Wyoming. We must protect KTLN in Denver and so we are cancelling our signal towards Denver.

Thank you for your reception report. Please let us know if we are heard in Omaha very often. Also you may be interested in noticing that the station is now owned by Curt Gowdy of N.B.C. sports.
