
Thank you for your reception report of April 27, 1969. I am very sorry that I haven't answered sooner, but I have only recently become KRCB's Chief Engineer, and it has taken most of my time to get things in order. Reception reports were on the bottom of the pile!

Your report checks with our programming log. Yes, yours was our first FM reception report, though you did not hear our first programmed transmissions. April 25, 1969, at 4:30 p.m. was our first official programmed FM transmissions. (Of course, we had many tests before that date.)

KRCB-FM uses an RCA transmitter and antenna, with 100 KW effective radiated power. We are, as you know, on 98.5 MHz. Our FM station is fulltime, and has the same contemporary music programming as our sister station, KRCB-AM. (AM has also RCA facilities, with 1000 watts, at 1560, with daytime operation only.)

Thank you, again, very much for your reception report. I am sorry, but we have no QSL cards available yet. Keep listening to the Big 15-6, and 73's!
