Dear Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 10th October, 1945.

With the meagre information available I cannot definitely confirm that the station you heard was in the Sudan. But we do operate many transmitters for internal telegraph traffic on about the frequency you mention and the station you heard may have been:-

Omdurman Radio	- -	Call Sign	STK.
Power C.W.	- -		2.5 K.W.
Frequency	- -		572.5 Kcs.
Service	- -		Sudan Posts and Telegraphs internal telegraph traffic.

Fixed Station.

It may be of interest to you to know that the Sudan Broadcasting Service broadcasts on wavelengths of:-

22.52 metres	13.320	kcs.

524 metres	572.5	kcs.
