Dear David:

This is to confirm your report of reception of WMOB.

Our call letters are the same as the station you monitored in 1940 when you lived in Ohio, but this is the only affiliation. That station suddenly went off the air about 1945 when it was bought out by a competitive concern in the city. We were WTUF and our call letters were changed to WMOB on January 29, 1969.

Enclosed find rate card which makes a good QSL card, coverage map, and business card.

We are proud of our station and equipment. Our transmitter is a Collins 820-1D, our console is a Gates Diplomat running through the CBS laboratories Audimax and Volumax. From start to finish our audio signal passes through only 4 tubes, the modulator and power final (EIMAC 5-500A). The tower is a guyed 295 feet with the conventional copper wire radials. It is practically sitting in Mobile Bay! I think it is a tower, it could be a super bouy.

Many thanks for your fine report. I noticed the commemorative Alabama stamp. Nice of you to take the trouble.
