
Thank you for your interesting letter of the 11th July, 1945, together with the reception reports. I think that you probably have received Jerusalem on 668 kc/s during our nightly relays from the so called "British Mediterranean Station", the programmes of which we broadcast from the 1st August, 1943, to the 10th January, 1945, from 2000 to 2130 hours G.M.T.

These programmes consisted of news bulletins in Turkish, Rumanian, Greek, Serbian, German, English, Italian and French linked by harp interval signals and included short classical concerts twice weekly.

Your DX card for 7.215 kc/s apparently concerns one of the transmitters of the British Mediterranean Station, at that time run by the Psychological Warfare Branch (P.W.B.). I have passed your report to the Chief Engineer of this organisation, who will no doubt communicate with you direct.

In conclusion I should like to thank you for the trouble you have taken in compiling these log reports.
