Dear Dave:

Thank you very much for your report of reception of KWOR Radio. It pleases us to know that our 250 watts did the job, all the way to Ohio. This is the first such report of any reception east of the Mississippi. We have had reception reports from Texas, California, and of all places, New Zealand.

What you heard the night of March 16, was a frequency monitoring schedule with Long Beach California. On our freq checks we use a 1,000 cycle tone with the call letters sent three times every five minutes from 12:15-12:30 AM PST. We have just recently used the call letters in code, and have reports such as yours flowing in.

We operate on 250 watts, unlimited, using an RCA console, operate remotely from the transmitter, two miles away with Rust remote equipment. Our transmitter is in a clay bed, 150 feet high. We are located just three miles from the Colorado River, on the state line of Arizana. Blythe is 223 miles from Los Angades and 160 miles from Phoenix, Arizona, to give you some idea of our geographical location.

If you are interested in monitoring us again, our frequency checks are for a 15 minute duration, 3:15-3:30 AM, EST. We are always interested in reports from as far away as Ohio. Sorry I could not give you more technical data, but our engineer is not available now.

If you hear us again, we would be interested in knowing our signal strength, and the amount of QRN/M.
