This letter is to verify your reception of radio station KLAK on May 5th, 1956 from 2:33 to 2:45 AM, EST as we were conducting our regular monthly frequency check. Our checks are held the 1st Saturday of the month from 12:30 to 12:45 AM, MST with Commercial Radio Monitoring Company in Kansas City. We enjoyed hearing from you and hope you can again log KLAK in the future.

For your information Lakewood is a suburb of Denver located about 5 miles straight West of the "Mile-Hi" city. Lakewood now has an estimated population of 35,000 people and is still growing along with the rest of the metropolitan Denver area. It is only a short 10 minute drive from Lakewood to the foothills of the famous Rocky Mountains of Colorado.

KLAK has received reports from 19 states as well as 2 provinces of Canada and 12 reports from New Zealand so you see our 250 watts really travels. Most of these were on frequency checks but KLAK has been heard on regular schedule as far away as Fort Wayne, Indiana & Seattle, Washington. Our studios and transmitter are located in "This Old House" at 1315 Oak street in Lakewood. Our broadcast schedule for August is 5:15 AM to 7:00 PM daily.

I want to apologize for taking so long in answering your reception report. Mr. Skillin hasn't had time to answer any reports so I recently volunteered to answer reports for him. I hope this letter serves as satisfactory verification of your report.
