** We are happy to learn that you made an attempt to DX us on March 29. It is my impression from what you said in yo ur letter that the stronger station you heard was not us. The weaker station probably was us. We are using a variety of tones from 50Hz to 10kHz for our tests. We increased our power at 0000MST since we are legal for 5kW at this time. We did how ever operate at lov power (500 W) untill then, although it was probably to weak for you to receive. We did have several ID's but they could have been at such a low level that you could not receive them.
