Dear Mr. Thomas,

Thank you for your letter of the 25th February and for your reception report.

I can confirm that you have received our 881 kc/s Medium Wave transmitter located at Washford in Somerset. This transmitter radiates the Welsh Home Service and has a radiated power of 100 kilowatts. As far as reception of the Welsh Home Service is concerned (in the United Kingdom), our Washford transmitter covers only an area of South Wales extending approximately to mid-Wales, and if you travelled to Rugby it is very unlikely that you received the Washford transmitter when you were in the United Kingdom.

I enclose a small booklet which gives details and shows the location of the various BBC transmitters. I found your letter and report most interesting and I see you are aware that various people in the United States have been receiving our Medium Wave transmitter during the past month or so.
