Dear Mr. D. Thomas,

We thank you for your letter dated September 10th 1964, which was very interesting as it gave us information about our transmissions on medium waves in various areas.

Your remarks related with the territory of Near East and Egypt are coinciding with those sent by a few dixerers of these areas or Greeks who live there.

Even from Finland and Norway we had in the past but little information about our transmissions on 728 Kc/s and 1385 Kc/s, which was rather favourable. But this do not happen with yours.

Please note the Power of our stations which is as follows:

Athens I, 728 Kc/s, 150 KW  
" II, 1385 Kc/s, 50 KW  
" III, 665 Kc/s, 15 KW

Your information about Athens III 665 Kc/s was very interesting as we had not same from remoted areas.

Athens 1313 Kc/s is served by the Army, but Corfu station, 1007 Kc/s, 50 KW belongs to our Institute.


Enclosed, please, find the list of frequencies of our short wave stations for the present period.
