Dear David:

Thank you very much for your reception report of WFUN in which you reported that you received WFUN on the morning of January 23, 1968. This letter will verify that you did receive WFUN on the above morning from 3:30-4:30 AM EST.

WFUN's signal to the north is very hard to receive due to all the QRM up there. The Cuban station on 790 prevents our signal from getting out since we have to protect their signal very heavily. I believe that the Cuban station signs off at 1 AM so after that time WFUN's signal is improved. Our night-pattern brings our signal out into the Bahamas where we have a good signal both day and night. At night, the Cuban cuts in after Fort Lauderdale (to the north) and north of Homestead (to the south) but after the Cuban signs off, our signal can be read fairly well down in Jamaica. Our daytime signal reaches up to Martin County (0.5 MV/M).

We don't receive many reception reports but when we do they usually come from the New York area. Our furthest reports are from New Zealand and England.

Thanks once again for the interest that you have shown WFUN and I hope that you will have continued success in your DXing efforts.
