Dear David,

We received your fine business report the other day and I want to write and let you know that we do really appreciate you fellows out there letting us know what our sigs sound like way out. Your report is correct so maybe you are interested in the type equipment we are using here.

Our transmitter is an old RCA 250 E and radiator system consists of a 175' grounded vertical and ground system consists of 120 radials each 250' long out at equal angles from base screen 18' x 24' at base of tower. The transmitter at present is located about 2 miles out of town but we are planning on moving our transmitter to our studio site in the New Albany Hotel in town, with 150' tower on roof, the transmitter when we get moved will be a Western Electric 310A--our power will remain the same 250 Watts but are hoping for increased primary coverage by increasing our rapid-fading contour. Our audio equipment consists of 2- WE 23B consoles--RCA mechanical turntables (3) 2 equipped with WE9A diamond pickup heads and one with RCA MI-11244head.

We make our reg freq checks on the 2nd Tuesday of each month from 3:05 to 3:15 AM so hope to hear again.
