Dear Mr. Thomas:

Please allow me to acknowledge the receipt of your favor of August 2nd and to say that your report of having heard Station WJTL on Sunday morning August 2nd is correct. We were broadcasting our mid-night to-dawn program and will be on the air every Saturday night from 12 mid-night until 4:00 A.M. CST. We trust that you will "tune in" often and let us hear from you.

Station WJTL has been operating since May 23rd 1931 and we have a really wonderful little station here of 100 watts and 100 % modulation and crystal control. We broadcast on a frequency of 1370 kilocycles, 218.7 meters. Station WJTL is the only station of its kind in the country, the programs being entirely for educational purposes.

I am enclosing herewith a radio catalogue and schedule of programs in which you will doubtless be interested.
