Thanks very much for your acknowledgement of reception on our Sunday morning broadcasts. This letter will verify proof of reception and are sorry that we do not have an ekko stamp.

WRBL is licensed for 50 watts, however our transmitter is only radiating 25 watts. In a few weeks we will install new equipment to bring the power up to full 50 watts and will appreciate you again advising us of your reception.

Our Sunday morning broadcasts will continue for several weeks, beginning at 3 A. M. Central Standard Time, and we are counting on you as a listener and will thank you to invite all your friends to tune in on WRBL, 1200 kilocycles. We will verify all proofs of reception. Of course, any publicity given these broadcasts will be appreciated.

We have received over 130 distant letters reporting on the reception of our broadcasts the past two Sundays.
