Please accept this letter as official verification of your reception of KWCR on January 16, 1950 from 3:00 to 4:00 a.m. CST.


The transmitter is a Collins 300G as is most of the associated equipment here at KWCR.

This KWCR is an entirely new station. The old call of KWCR was deleted about 1934 or 35 and became a part of WMT. An old KWCR tower still stands on the roof of the Montrose Hotel and supports a large neon sign for WMT. This station first began operation at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday August 14, 1949.
