Dear Mr. Thomas:

Thank you for your verification of reception of WDLM. You are the farthest listener to the south that I am aware of during this test. Another DX'er in Decatur, Georgia received the test with super clarity, including the hymns that I played. Due to adverse weather conditions, even the closer-in responses did not read much more than the sweep-tones and code ID's.

Enclosed is a current confirmation card as well as an older card for your information. WMBI-AM is still on the air with 5000 watts, which has been on the air since 1928 and was granted their first license on July 28, 1926 for a few hours a day at 500 watts.

One of the first non-commercial FM stations on the air, commenced operation in 1943 in Chicago, with the call letters of WDLM and then ceased operation in the early 50's due to the FM band shift. Then WMBI-FM went on the air with 100 Kilowatts on July 25, 1960.

Our AM station - WDLM, began operation on April 3, 1960 and retained the call letters of our founder, Dwight Lyman Moody. On January 20, 1980, we added WDLM-FM.

Moody radio has two stations in your area acquired from Keswick. They are WGNB, 1520 Khz and WKES, 102 FM in St. Petersburg FL.

I hope that this will give you a little information concerning some of your former QSL cards.
