Dear Mr. Thomas:

Thank you very much for your reporting of reception of the tones of WNWI during our TEST for the National Radio Club. Your reporting of our lower tone and the times agree with my log and you can consider this official verification of WNWI. You are my farthest report so far, with one other of considerable distance coming from Dan Shoaf in Houston. I am sorry that distances didn't come in well from the west, as the farthest report to the west came only from Omaha ~~xxx~~ with a faint signal.

The louder 1000 cp tone was from WKLO who signed off exactly at the same time we came on. Nice of them. Hi!!! I have received a total of 45 reports from 20 states and also 3 from Ontario and 1 from Quebec, that being Andy Fugg. Also, we were heard with a descent log in Ansonia and Fairfield, Connecticut, which is much more than I had anticipated.

Our equipment is mostly RCA in the studios and transmitter with other makes of tape machines and modulation limiters. The antenna is a 310 foot vertical, guyed, non-directional tower with approximately 33,000 feet of buried #10 copper wire for a ground system.

Thanks again for the reception report, and anytime you get a chance to go by here, feel free to stop in for a chat. Our studios are always open to the public to observe, et al.
