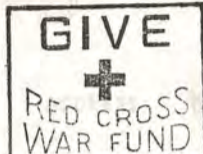

THE PHOTOGRAPH, left to right—

First two racks house FM monitoring equipment. Following two panels is front of FM 1kw transmitter, WBRL. Rear wall panels are front of WJBO, 5kw transmitter, shown in part. Center desk is control console for both stations. Fake drawer arrangement opens to left and has a sliding shelf with a turntable and pickup, complete with microphone and mixer set-up. The microphone is placed on the console desk and the turn-table slides out for playing records. This is where the NRC DX shows originate each third Monday of the month from 1 to 3 A. M., Central War Time.
