Many thanks for your letter reporting reception of our AM and FM station.

Sorry we do not have any verification cards but this letter will certify that your reception is correct, as I checked with our program log of the time and date.


Regarding FM I am sorry to state that we discontinued operation as of June 30th because there were so few listeners who were interested.

Even people who had FM on their AM sets admitted they never used them, and some admitted that when the FM went out they never bothered to have it fixed.

We now have a 10 kw RCA FM transmitter and 547 ft. tower with 4 section Pylon, laying idle. When we were on the air we had an effective radiated power of 60 kw.

Yes, I remember back in 1925 when we were on the air 25 hours per week and all live talent, no phonograph records were used. I have been here since the first day the station went on the air, April 21, 1925.
