Dear Mr. Thomas:

This will verify your reception report of our special test on January 18th, from 4:30 AM to 5:00 AM E.S.T. It checks correctly with our station log. We have A 2 tower directional antenna, which however reduces our strength in one direction only, and that is 45 degrees North east toward WNBP Newburyport, Mass, which station is on our frequency. So we are substantially 1000 Watts in most any direction away from the Atlantic Ocean.

Ironically one of the best signal reports I had was from the farthest report recieved to date; from Len Kruse, 816 Euclid Street, Dubuque, Iowa. We subdued XESM at that location, and of course was due to our sky-wave skip being just right and the skip from the Mexican station being weaker at that point. Out of the first 20 reports recieved several were from Pennsylvania, one from Staten Island, and 2 from Illinoise.
