First let me say that your report just arrived today on my desk. I can not find out where it has been since the office help found it in the file.

Yes, this is the first mobile reception report that we have received. It was very interesting to read.

We have had other reports from the Maine and Canada area. We get good reports from Southern Maine and then again from P.E.I. and Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. We seem to skip from Bangor, Maine to Canada. Of course, this is way beyond our expected coverage anyway.

We have had reports that we are one of the best Boston stations in the Eastern Canada area.


The power here is 5,000 watts non-directional in the daytime and directional North-Northeast at night. That may account for it.

This letter will verify your report of reception of this station at 0600 EDST on the 6th of July 1954.

The other station you reported on is W J D A also here in the Boston area. However they are in Quincy, Massachusetts which is just five miles to the Southeast. They are 1,000 watts daytime only. I think their frequency is 1300 kcs. Our transmitter is also in Quincy.
