Dear Mr. Thomas

Many thanks for your letter of November 19th with details of your logging of our 0500 - 0515 AM frequency check period of the above date.


The information you have given would indicate that you copied WFAU without any doubt and it is a pleasure for us to verify your reception at that time.

WFAU uses a Raytheon 250 watt transmitter, feeding a quarter wave vertical radiator through 420' of co-ax line. Our offices, studios, control room and transmitter are located under one roof, and we are situated about one mile from the center of town, on a main highway. The ground system consists of 120 radials approximately one quarter wave long.

I should judge from the card that you have considerable equipment available to you, but I should imagine that a good deal of perseverance was required to separate WFAU from the congestion on 1340 KC, although we do receive quite a few reports from the central part of the country. Conditions probably are right at times for this type of reception.

Thanks again for your nice report, and I would like to wish you the best of success in your quest for DX. 73
