Thank you sincerely for your report of reception of our station during the special DX test we held on December 1, 1958. It was indeed gratifying to receive so many letters from the faithful Radio Club Members such as yourself.

Yours is quite an official-lookin' letter, Mr. Thomas! You gave all the ;information about your receiver and such -- I wish I could tell you more about our equipment, but it's impossible. Our general-manager, chief engineer is out of the office at this time, however.

We DO have three towers - and of course, are directional after sunset. However, when we stay on the air later than 11:04, our regular sign-off time, we can increase the power to 5,000 watts. There is another station in our town -- WAPF, which is 1,000 watts daytime only.

McComb is located only about 10 miles from the Louisiana state line, and approximately 90 miles from the Mississippi Gulf coast. We're in a chiefly rural trade area.

We were very happy to receive your report, and during our next DX test, which we hope will be in the near future, we hope to hear from you again soon.
