We should like to thank you for your report of reception of WLOX, June 24, 1953, and are very happy to confirm same.

Possibly you would be interested in the transmitter and equipment line-up at WLOX. The transmitter is a Western Electric 250 watt commercial model, consisting of Western Electric Crystal controlled oscillator, 6L6 buffer, 814 driver, and six push-pull parallel WE 242-c Power amplifiers, control-grid modulated by parallel 6L6's. The transmitting tower is located at sea level on the beach, and is fed by 600 feet of air-dielectric coax transmission line.
