This is gonna look like kind of formal or lezy like, but it is about the only thing we can do to get an answer to all the responses to the many kind DX'ers that were listening the morning of January 28, 1952, from 1:30 a.m. till 3:00 a.m., MST. 20

To date I have counted 20 letters from those who heard us that morning.

Adding to the verification side of the whole thing, here are some of the things mentioned during the broadcast that morning:

Theme: National Emblem March;

Call letters: Now KCAP, formerly KPDV before the first of the year;

Temperature: Reported at 40 degrees above zero;

Some of the pop tunes played:

Five Foot Two, Eyes of Blue

Down Yonder

March Music (I Don't remember the title)

Waiting for the Robert E. Lee

Shoo, Shoo, Baby;

Talk about the DX'ers;

Helena's elevation;

More idle chatter mentioning the names of those present at the time of the broadcast, including Lee Dobler, Allan Nowotny, and myself, Dean Mack,

Signed off at 3:00 a.m. to the themesong of the DX'ers, the National Emblem March.
