Dear Mr. Thomas:

This verifies your reception of our Transmitter CMB2 at 8:45 P.M. EST. on the evening of January 23rd. at which time we were preparing for the transmission of the President of Cuba's Address to the people of the United States following the recognition of his Government by the United States. The call letters CMA, were erroneously used for a time, but on subsequent transmission the proper call - CMB2 was used.

The President's address was transmitted at 11:00 P.M. and rebroadcast over the NBC System in the States.

Station CMC mentioned in your letter is located in Havana, but not operated by this Company.

Station CMB is operated by us, and was on the air December 17th testing with the writer who was at that time listening in at San Francisco, California.

We thank you for your communication, and hope to hear from you again. Our primary function is International Telegraph Communications, but we do occasionally handle Broadcast Programs of Cuban origin for rebroadcasting in the United States.
