I thank you very much for your letter of recent in which you mention listening to our special DX programme aired from 5:00 to 6:00 a.m., AST, on January 17th.

The details you are giving us are quite accurate and I thank you very much for giving us the details on reception. You will find attached a copy of log of the DX programme and the correct details given in your report have been checked in ink.


In your letter, you mention that you heard CBAF last summer but it was all in French. We are a basic station of the CBC French Network and as such we broadcast in French exclusively. As a matter of fact, we are the first French CBC station outside the province of Quebec and also the only one in the central part of the Maritimes. When you were returning from Sackville, you indeed passed by our transmitter, about 5 miles from Moncton on the right-hand side coming from Sackville to Moncton. As we have nobody at the transmitter as same is unattended, this is probably the reason why you found nobody around. The technicians go there only for maintenance.

Our special DX programme was quite successful as we have received over 30 letters and we are most happy about this.
