REMARKS Thanks for going out of your way to write a very full letter in addition to your report card. As you suspect, we have a highly directional antenna designed to keep us from interfering with U. S. A. stations. Centre of our directional beam is 10 degrees South of East, so if you will check us on map you will see that we have no business in your territory at all. Very glad, therefore, to know that you managed to pull in even a weak signal. The airport(?) QRM you noted was remarked on by several others. Thanks again and best 73's
