The occasion: all wires---telegraph, telephone, railway, ---everything in fact---were taken out by a severe sleet storm last Thursday---Nov. 20. Since then---for more than five days---WDAY and KFYZ have maintained constant communication, exchanging train orders, messages, etc.


These two stations have provided the only means of communication in a major part of North Dakota.

The program you listened to was a part of this constant communication.
